RE: July 2012 Drug Testing Statistics

***NOTE: The Pretrial Services Agency will disseminate drug testing statistics for both adult arrestees and juveniles in a single monthly report. Future reports shall be disseminated electronically and will be available on-line at [www.psa.gov](http://www.psa.gov).***

### July 2012 Adult Drug Test Statistics

Drug testing of adult arrestees for July 2012 revealed a 1% decrease in the overall positive test rate (down from 29% to 28%) from June 2012. Multi-positives, cocaine and PCP revealed a 1% percent decrease respectively. Amphetamines levels remained consistent with last month.

## **July 2012 Juvenile Drug Test Statistics**

Drug testing of juveniles (both lockup and community cases) for July 2012 revealed a 3% increase in the level of marijuana use and a 1% decrease in amphetamine use from June 2012. Multi-positives, cocaine and PCP remained consistent with last month.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 139 respondents prior to their appearance in July. Of the 131 lockup cases, 69 (53%) tested positive. Of the 8 community cases, 1 (12%) tested positive for marijuana. The combined positive rate was 50%, up from the previous month.
