RE: May 2013 Drug Testing Statistics

May 2013 Adult Drug Test Statistics

Drug testing of adult arrestees for May 2013 revealed a 1% increase in the overall positive test rate (up from 28% to 29%) from April 2013. Opiate levels revealed a 1% percent decrease. PCP levels revealed a 1% percent increase. Cocaine, amphetamines and multi-drug positives levels remained consistent with last month.

May 2013 Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics

Drug testing of juveniles (both lockup and community cases) for May 2013 revealed a 4% decrease in the level of marijuana use. Multi-drug positives and cocaine levels revealed a 1% decrease and PCP remained consistent with last month.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 165 respondents prior to their appearance in May. Of the 150 lockup cases, 57 (38%) tested positive. Of the 15 community cases, 5 (33%) tested positive for marijuana. The combined positive rate was 38%, down from the previous month.
