Drug testing of adult arrestees for August 2016 remained the same compared to the previous month in the overall positive test rate. PCP use decreased by 4% compared to last month.

August 2016 Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics

The positive rate for juvenile drug testing for August 2016 (both lockup and community cases) increased by 11% compared to last month.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 110 respondents prior to their appearance in August 2016. Of the 101 lockup cases, 45 (45%) tested positive for marijuana. Of the 9 community cases, 7 (78%) tested positive for marijuana.

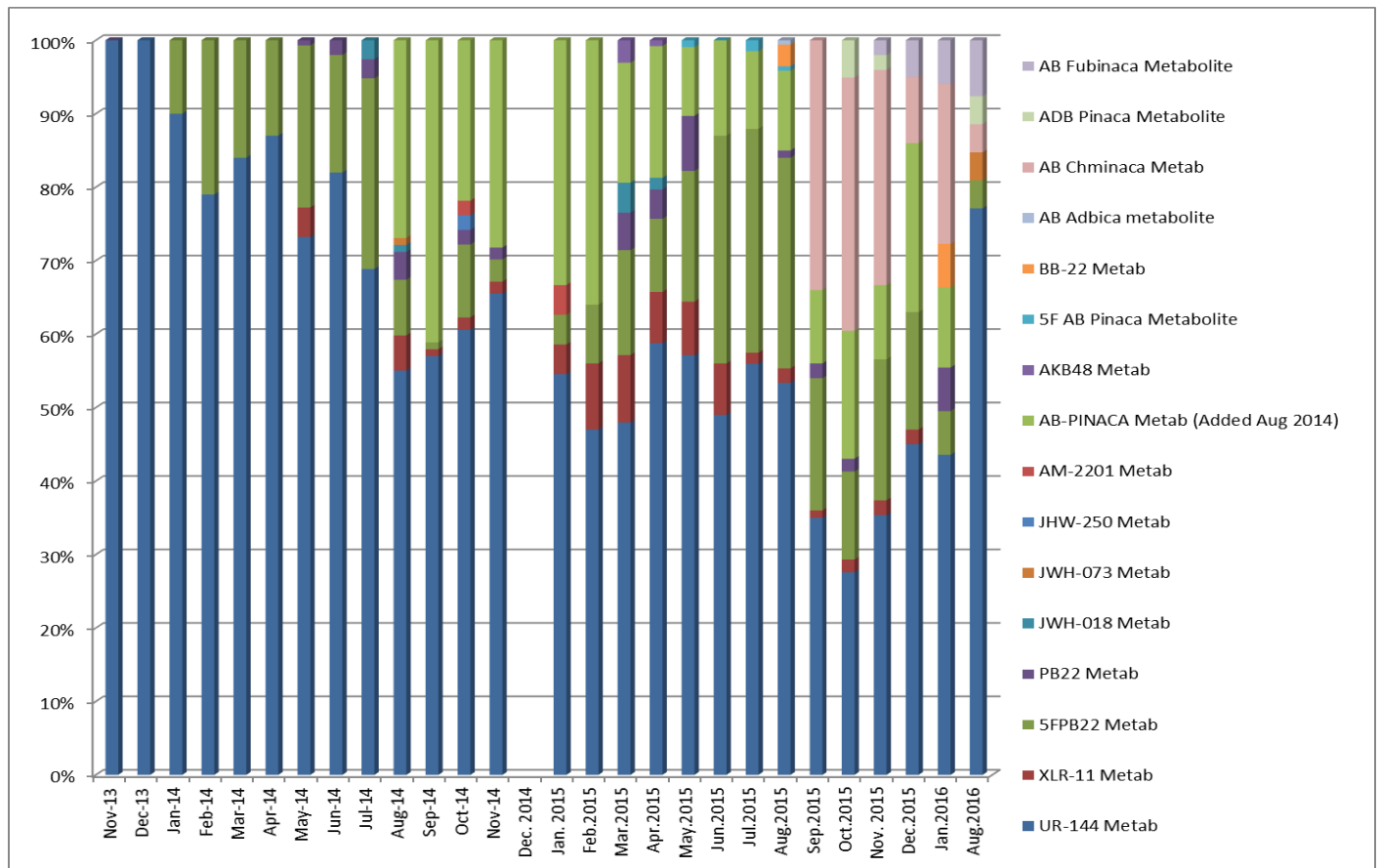
