Drug testing of adult arrestees for January 2016 showed a 1% decrease from the previous month in the overall positive test rate. PCP use decreased 4% compared to last month.

The positive rate for juvenile drug testing for January 2016 (both lockup and community cases) decreased by 1% when compared to last month.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 107 respondents prior to their appearance in January 2016. Of the 103 lockup cases, 49 (48%) tested positive for marijuana. Of the 4 community cases, 2 (50%) tested positive for marijuana.

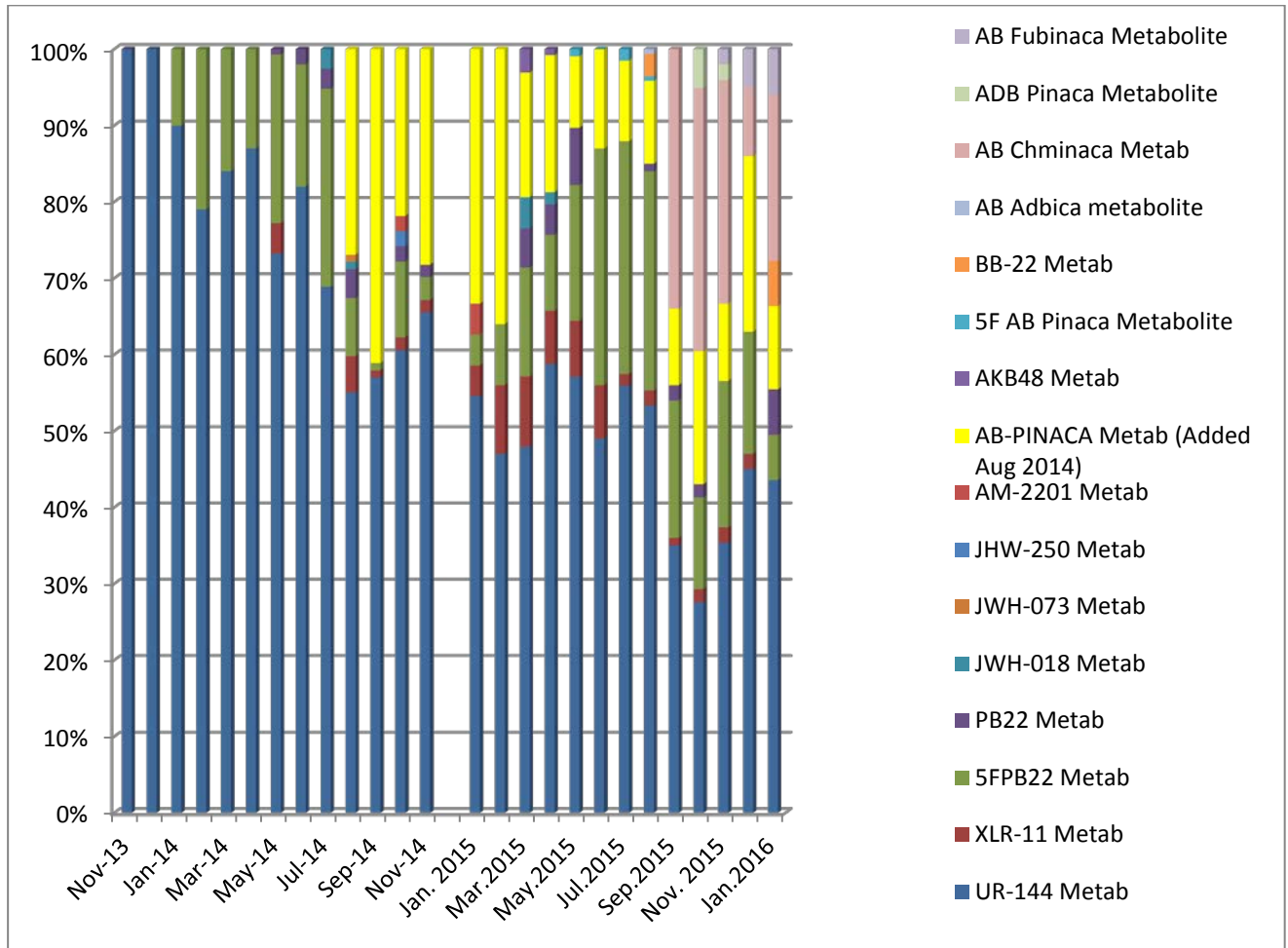
