Drug testing of adult arrestees for October 2016 increased by 2% in the overall positive test rate. PCP use decreased by 3% compared to last month.

The positive rate for juvenile drug testing for October 2016 (both lockup and community cases) increased by 3% compared to last month.

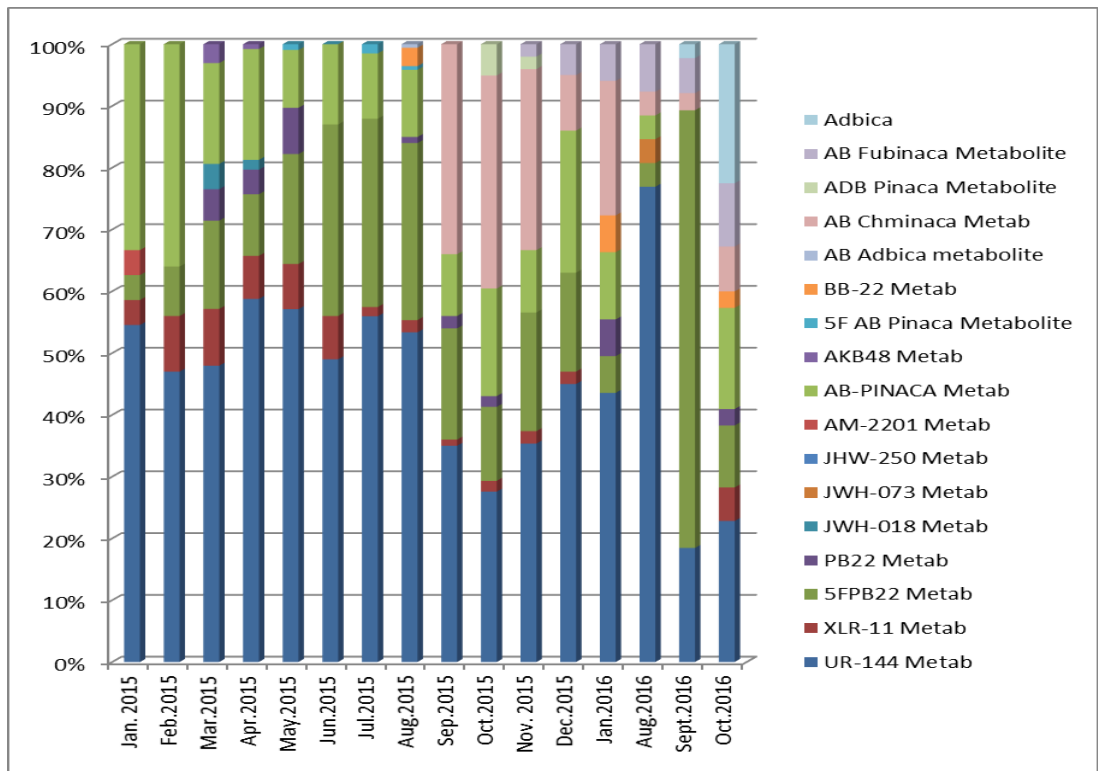
