RE: <u>Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics for August 2005</u>

Drug testing of juvenile arrestees for August 2005 revealed a significant increase in the level of substance abuse detected for marijuana, which was up 14% from July, to 60%. The level of substance abuse detected for PCP was down 1% from the previous month at 3%, while cocaine remained the same at 4%.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 179 respondents prior to their initial hearing in August. Sixty-three percent (63%) of the 163 Lockup cases tested positive. Thirty-eight percent (38%) of the 16 Community cases tested positive. The combined positive rate was 61%, up 11% from July.
