### **MEMORANDUM**

RE: February 2008 Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics

Drug testing of juvenile arrestees for February 2008 revealed a decrease in the levels of substance abuse detected for marijuana and PCP, which were down 2% and 3% from January to 52% and 1%, respectively. The levels of substance abuse detected for cocaine and amphetamines increased 2% and 3% from the previous month to 2% and 5%, respectively.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 185 respondents prior to their initial hearing in February. Fifty-three percent (53%) of the 158 Lockup cases tested positive. Fifty-nine percent (59%) of the 27 Community cases tested positive. The combined positive rate was 54% -- the same as the previous month.


