## **MEMORANDUM**

RE: January 2008 Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics

Drug testing of juvenile arrestees for January 2008 revealed a decrease in the levels of substance abuse detected for cocaine and marijuana, which were down 2% and 4% from December to 0% and 54%, respectively. The levels of substance abuse detected for PCP and amphetamines increased 2% and 1% from the previous month to 4% and 2%, respectively.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 215 respondents prior to their initial hearing in January. Fifty-six percent (56%) of the 186 Lockup cases tested positive. Thirty-eight percent (38%) of the 29 Community cases tested positive. The combined positive rate was 54% -- down 4% from December.


