RE: Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics for June 2004

Drug testing of juvenile arrestees for June 2004 revealed a decrease in the level of substance abuse detected for cocaine, which was down 1% from May, to 2%. The levels of substance abuse detected for marijuana and PCP increased 1% and 3% from the previous month, to 49% and 3%, respectively.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 103 respondents prior to their initial hearing in June. Forty-nine percent (49%) of the 89 Lockup cases tested positive. Forty-three percent (43%) of the 14 Community cases tested positive. The combined positive rate was 49%, up 1% from May.

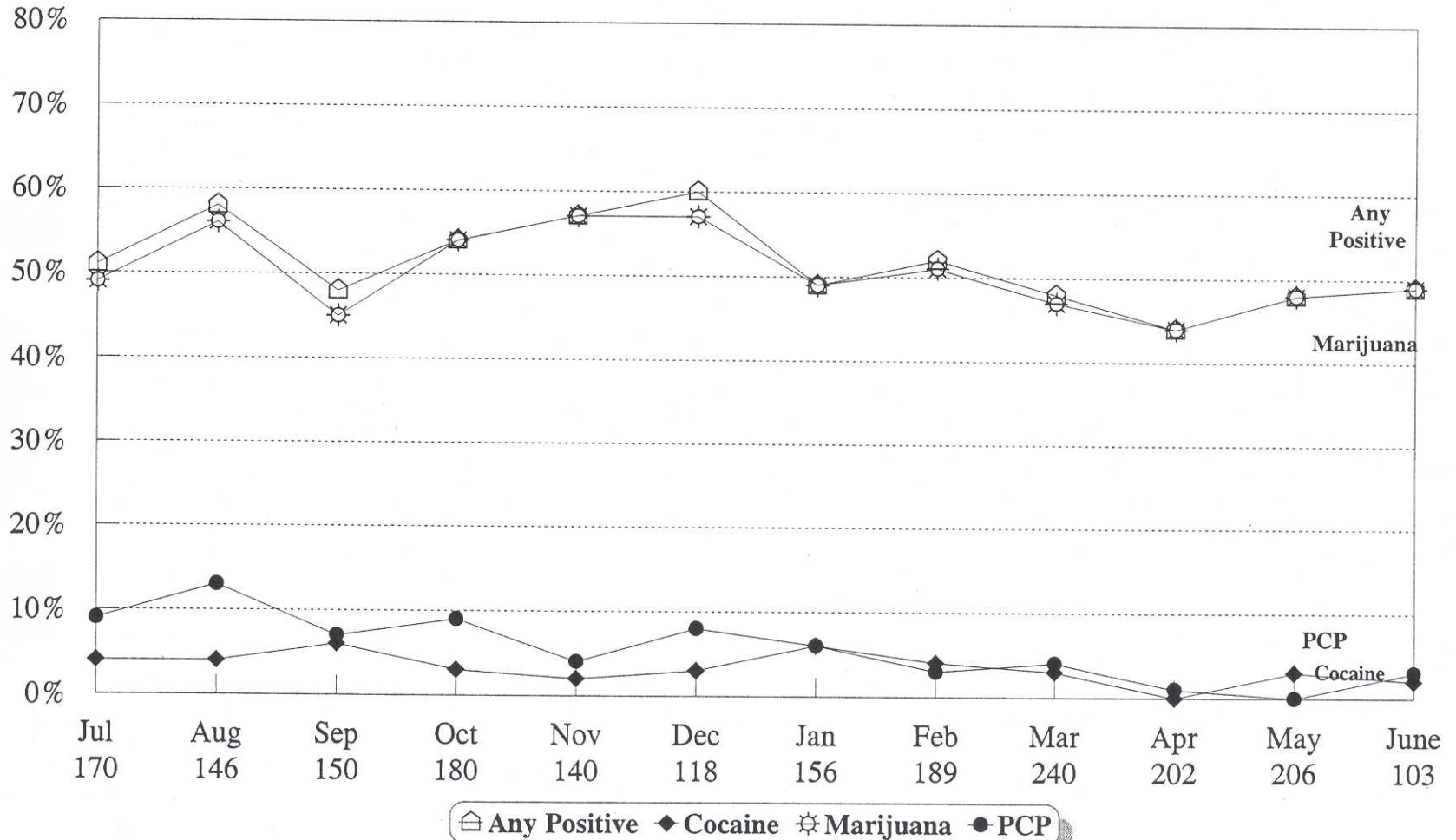
