RE: Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics for June 2006

Drug testing of juvenile arrestees for June 2006 revealed a decrease in the level of substance abuse detected for PCP, which was down 1% from May, to 0%. The levels of substance abuse detected for marijuana and cocaine were up 8% and 2% from the previous month, to 55% and 5%, respectively.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 198 respondents prior to their initial hearing in June. Fifty-eight percent (58%) of the 156 Lockup cases tested positive. Fifty percent (50%) of the 42 Community cases tested positive. The combined positive rate was 56% -- up 7% from May.

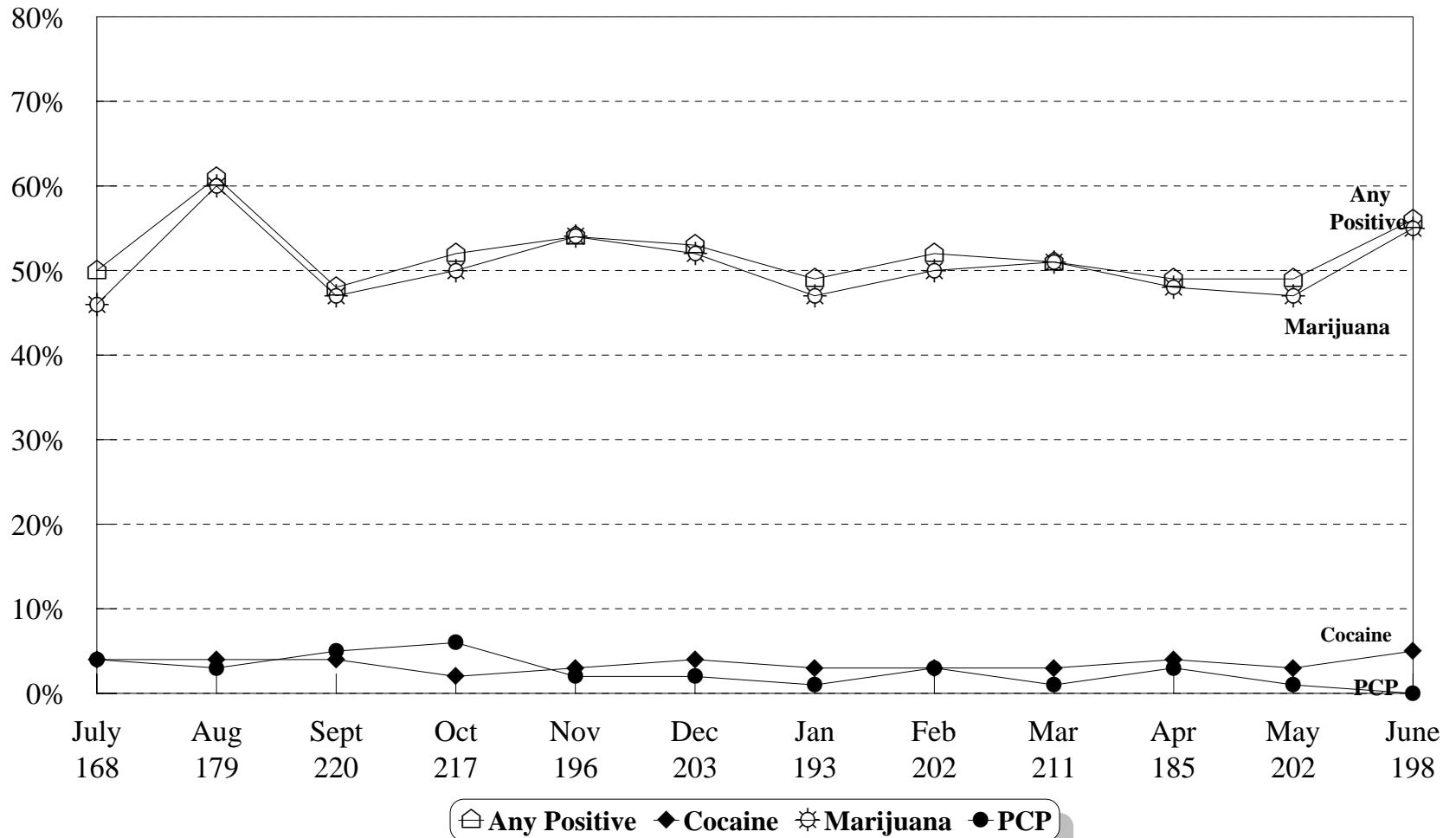
