RE: <u>Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics for March 2004</u>

Drug testing of juvenile arrestees for March 2004 revealed a decrease in the levels of substance abuse detected for marijuana and cocaine, which were down 4% and 1% from February, to 47% and 3%, respectively. The level of substance abuse detected for PCP increased 1% from the previous month to 4%.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 240 respondents prior to their initial hearing in March. Forty-nine percent (49%) of the 224 Lockup cases tested positive. Thirty-one percent (31%) of the 16 Community cases tested positive. The combined positive rate was 48%, down 4% from February.
