RE: Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics for May 2006

Drug testing of juvenile arrestees for May 2006 revealed a decrease in the level of substance abuse detected for PCP, which was down 2% from April, to 1%. The levels of substance abuse detected for marijuana and cocaine were down 1% each from the previous month, to 47% and 3%, respectively.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 202 respondents prior to their initial hearing in May. Fifty-four percent (54%) of the 153 Lockup cases tested positive. Thirty-one percent (31%) of the 49 Community cases tested positive. The combined positive rate was 49% -- the same as April.
