RE: <u>November 2007 Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics</u>

Drug testing of juvenile arrestees for November 2007 revealed a decrease in the level of substance abuse detected for amphetamines, which was down 2% from October, to 1%. The levels of substance abuse detected for PCP and cocaine decreased 1% each from the previous month to 3% and 2%, respectively, while marijuana increased 2%, to 56%.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 205 respondents prior to their initial hearing in November. Sixty-one percent (61%) of the 166 Lockup cases tested positive. Thirty-eight percent (38%) of the 39 Community cases tested positive. The combined positive rate was 57% -- up 3% from October.


