RE: Juvenile Drug Testing Statistics for September 2005

Drug testing of juvenile arrestees for September 2005 revealed a significant decrease in the level of substance abuse detected for marijuana, which was down 13% from August, to 47%. The level of substance abuse detected for PCP was up 2% from the previous month at 5%, while cocaine remained the same at 4%.

The Juvenile Drug Testing Unit tested 220 respondents prior to their initial hearing in September. Fifty-one percent (51%) of the 195 Lockup cases tested positive. Twenty-eight percent (28%) of the 25 Community cases tested positive. The combined positive rate was 48%, down 13% from August.


