**SUBJECT: April 2019 Drug Testing Statistics** 

The rate of positive results from drug testing of adult arrestees for April 2019 increased by 3% when compared to the previous month, with an overall positive test rate of 29%. Cocaine and PCP revealed a 2% and 1% increase, respectively. Multi-drug positives, opiates, amphetamines and synthetic cannabinoids each remained consistent. Heroin revealed a 1% decrease.


