SUBJECT: June 2017 Drug Testing Statistics

Drug testing of adult arrestees for June 2017 decreased by 2% when compared to last month. Cocaine levels revealed a 1% percent increase and amphetamines levels revealed a 1% decrease. Multi-drug positives, PCP, and opiates levels remained consistent with last month.


