### SUBJECT: June 2019 Drug Testing Statistics

The rate of positive results from drug testing of adult arrestees for June 2019 decreased by 1% when compared to the previous month, with an overall positive test rate of 28%. Multi-drug positives, cocaine, amphetamines and heroin each remained consistent. Opiates, PCP and synthetic cannabinoids revealed a 1% decrease, respectively.


