**SUBJECT: November 2018 Drug Testing Statistics** 

The rate of positive results from drug testing of adult arrestees for November 2018 decreased by 1% when compared to last month, with an overall positive test rate of 27%. Amphetamines and PCP revealed a 2% and 1% increase, respectively. Synthetic cannabinoids remained consistent. Multi-drug positives and heroin revealed a 1% decrease. Cocaine and opiates revealed a 3% and 2% decrease, respectively.


