



### Washington, DC Pretrial Facts and Figures

In Washington, DC, the vast majority of persons arrested and awaiting trial are released, either on their own personal recognizance or to the supervision of the Pretrial Services Agency for the District of Columbia (PSA). Below are release rates for fiscal years (FY) 2014 through 2017.

Fiscal Year	Release Rate
2014	92.04%
2015	91.29%
2016	94.33%
2017	93.92%
<b>Average</b>	<b>92.90%</b>

Historically, PSA has measured its performance using three key outcomes: arrest-free rate, appearance rate and continued pretrial release. During Fiscal Year 2016, a fourth outcome measure was added to examine judicial concurrence with PSA recommendations.

<b>Continued Pretrial Release</b> <i>Percentage of defendants who remain on release at the conclusion of their pretrial period without a pending request for removal or revocation due to non-compliance.</i>	<b>85%</b>	88%	88%	88%	87%
<b>Judicial Concurrence Rate</b> <i>Percentage of cases in which initial release orders match PSA recommendations.</i>	<b>70%</b>			72%	76%
